The Peruvian Asia - Pacific Study Centers Network (REDAP) has been created in 1997 with a main objective to contribute to a better insertion of Peru in the Asia Pacific region, by the means of establishing relationships of institutional collaboration about matters referred to this region and its countries members. To achieve this goal, it takes into account the relevant purpose of carrying out studies, institutional and cooperative relationships, within the region, as well as to intensify the participation of the Peruvian academic sector in the existent cooperation and integration in the Asia Pacific region.

The REDAP is integrated by the National University of Engineering, the Agrarian University La Molina, the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru, the Diplomatic Academy of Peru, the Peruvian University Cayetano Heredia, the Pacific University, the Lima University and the Superior School of Business Management (ESAN). These eight institutions perform their participation in a coordinated and combined way in all the concerning activities of the network, according to the organization's objectives.

The REDAP has designed a web site, with the objective of publishing its efforts and achievements in its mission, integrating Peru to the Asia Pacific Region. On this page, you can find research studies, current projects, the development of the interchange relationships and cooperation with other institutions of the region, reports, records, proposals and activities. During 2001 up to 2002, the REDAP has organized and participated on diverse activities. The ASC's members has also been participants of Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PECC) working group, and in this document its presence has been established in different fora.

REGIONALISM / MULTILATERALISM

- ❖ Participation of Fernando González Vigil in the workshop on "Issues of economic transition in development countries: toward Central Europe and Latin America". February 8th and 9th, 2001. Shanghai

- ❖ Organization of conference "Relations between Latin America and Asia Pacific region" - April 24th, 2001- where Hubert Wieland, Director of the Diplomatic Academy of Peru has been participated; Elard Escala, Director of Asia and Oceania of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and SOM of Peru in APEC; Alan Fairlie, Director of the CEAPEC-PUCP; and Juan Sotomayor on representation of ABAC.

- ❖ Fernando Gonzalez Vigil, on representation of REDAP, attended to the V APEC Round Table and APIAN workshop, held in Singapore on June 8th - 9th, 2001. His participation had two objectives: present the preliminary version of the paper "Preferential Trade Agreements in the Western Hemisphere" and participate in the Second Annual Report of APIAN.

- ❖ Fernando González Vigil has an active participation in the Seminar of the PECC Trade Forum on "Regional Trade Agreements" that carried out in Bangkok, on June 12th - 13th, 2001.

- ❖ Joint organization the ADP and the UP of the conference "Regionalism and Globalization: Are the FTAA and APEC alternatives or roads without exit?", which was offered by the Doctor Richard E. Feinberg, Director of APIAN. The event was carried out on July 18th, 2001.

- ❖ Joint organization by the ADP and PERUPEC of the conference "Relationships between Latin America and East Asia" carried out by Ippei Yamazawa, Professor of the Department of Economy of the University Hitotsubashi of Tokyo, on May 16th, 2002.

SHANGHAI DIRECTIVES 2001

- ❖ Representatives of REDAP met with the Ambassador Zhang Yang, Executive Director of APEC, who was in an official visit to Peru. June 2nd, 2001.

- ❖ Representatives of REDAP, Alan Fairlie and Miguel Angel Alcántara, attended to the High Level Meeting on Human Capacity Building at Beijing. Among the exposed subjects at this event, we have: “The challenge ahead: Moving from Old to New Stakeholders and better politic approaches” and “Strategic options, working to reach all the people and innovative cooperation, working with the Stakeholders” from May 18th - 20th , 2001. Both academic representatives integrated the Peruvian delegation, presided by the Peruvian Ambassador in the People’s Republic of China, Luzmila Zanabria Ishikawa. Alan Fairlie and Miguel Angel Alcántara also attended the "APEC Study Centres Consortium Meeting", where Alan Fairlie participated as chairman on the place of ‘Subregionalism and System of Multilateral Trade’.

- ❖ The second seminar was titled “Implications of the Beijing Initiative”. The speakers were Elard Escala, SOM PERU, Alan Fairlie, Director of the CEAPEC-PUCP; and Mai Guo Yan, Plenary and Plenipotentiary Ambassador of People’s Republic of China in Peru. This seminar was carried out on September 3rd , 2001.

- ❖ Participation on the conference "Relationships between Peru and China", event that was carried out on the occasion of the 30° anniversary of the establishment of the diplomatic relationships between Peru and the People’s Republic of China. On September, 2001.

- ❖ Participation on the event R&D Management, organized by the International Agency of Korea Co-operation (KOICA), where it has participated José Tavera as REDAP member. It was carried from 11th - 23rd , October 2001.

- ❖ As a guest, it has participated the former Ambassador of the People's Republic of China in Peru Zhu Xiang Zhong (1989-1990) who offered the conference "The Relationships Peru - China". This conference was carried out on October 29th 2001.

SECTORIAL TOPICS

- ❖ The REDAP participated in the Annual Meeting of the PECC-Pacific Food Outlook Workshop, carried out on April 15th - 18th 2001. This conference "Food Security in Peru", had the participation of Dr. Luis Jimenez Diaz and Dr. Elias Huertas.
- ❖ From May 8th - 10th 2001, Dr. Luis Jimenez, REDAP representative, participated into the working meeting of the PECC workshop, "Food Perspectives of the Pacific", carried out in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
- ❖ Participation into the Fourth Meeting of the "Eartquake and Tsunami Disaster Mitigation Technologies under integration for the Asia Pacific Region (EQTAP), which took place in Kamura – Japan, in December 2001. The article exposed was "Learning from the Atic Earthquake", carried out in Peru in June 2001.
- ❖ The REDAP in combined cooperation with the Institute of Industrial Science of the University of Tokyo, organized the Workshop Eartquake and Tsunami Disaster Mitigation Technologies under Integration for the Asia Pacific Region (EQTP), that carried out on July 16th -20th, 2001. The information about this event can be found in CD ROM version and in hard copies.
- ❖ From July 22nd - 27th 2001, the Professors Akimi Fujimoto, Kou Yamazaki, Masayo Igata and Rie Miyauro, from the Department of Bio-Business Administration and Information of the International Agriculture School and

Food Studies from the Agrarian University of Tokyo, visited us to evaluate the performance of a Comparative Research on Productive Systems, for Vietnam, Malaysia and Peru. In our country these research courses are developed at Pucará (Department of Junin) and Chacayllo (Department of Lima).

- ❖ Participation of Fernando González Vigil at the Conference PAFTAD 27 about “The new Economy: Struggles for the East of Asia and the Pacific”, which carried out in Canberra, from 20th - 22nd , October 2001.
- ❖ Combined participation of the MITINCI and the Chancellery delegations, as well as of Fernando González Vigil as an special guest, to the International Symposium “APEC Perspectives on 2002” that took place in Mexico, in November 2001.
- ❖ Participation at the Common Meeting of Latin America - Lima 2001 – Health’s Sector, carried out on September, 12th , 2002. On this opportunity, it was exhibited the improvements of the Health’s project “Health’s Relation Hispanic – American (EHAS): Efforts ahead to the reduction of the digital divide”, developed in Alto Amazonas.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

- ❖ Between October and December of 2001, it took place the First Research Competition Report for University Students “APEC: Peru in the Asia Pacific”. The jury of this competition was formed by representatives of the Peruvian University Cayetano Heredia, the Diplomatic Academy of Peru, ESAN and MITINCI. The objective of this competition was to promote the investigation related to the International Trade and the impact of APEC at the Asia - Pacific Region and inside the Peruvian Economy. The winner’s research report was the one developed by the students of the Pontifical

Catholic University of Peru (they have obtained the 1st and 3rd order merit) and the Pacific University obtained the 2nd order merit.

- ❖ During the 2001, there were Research Reports on “Globalization, Development and Trade: APEC and CAN” and the “Estimation Impact of Migratory Movements on the Peruvian Economy: That is the situation of APEC countries”.
- ❖ It has been developed research reports in coordination with the University of Tokyo. This reports are about earthquakes, tsunamis and the integration of APEC subjects.
- ❖ The REDAP has current researches:
 - Outlook Studies of The Industrial Environmental Technology in Peru: Necessities of a growing professional and counsellor.
 - Studies about poverty and Social Development, on combine coordination with Research Centers of PUCP.
 - Proposal Research about “The Consumption Structure and Exportation Oportunities for Peru”, “The development of the Aquaculture (activity that is referred to fatten fish) in Peru for the Exportation: white meat species” and “The Preservation and the Management of the Inheritance Geological Mining of the Country”.
 - SME industrial Exporters: Competitive and Integration from the industrial exporters SME of Peru”.
 - International Trade in Services: “Peruvian Manufactured Industry and it’s exports performance in the Andean Market”. It’s objective is to evaluate the tendencies of the Peruvian exports on nineties and the exported orientation

of the manufactured sectors of Peru and its relation with the Andean Market and other cooperation and integration fora.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

- ❖ Among the activities of the organizer, PUCP's APEC Study Center. It has been developed the cycle of conferences about Chinese, Japanese and Korean literature, art, music and history, including the non member countries of APEC as India. These courses are guided to university students and common public.

- ❖ Actually, it has maintained agreements with Universities of Asia, as well as integral program of scholarships and researches reports. Last activities were carried out with:

Therefore, it was received a rough draft for the sign of the Cooperation Agreement among this Academic Institution and the REDAP. At the present, this proposal has been approved by the different institutions of the REDAP.
